

Fun to try at home...

- **Chalk!**

Go outside and draw. Talk about the drawings and what you see around you.

- **Act out a favorite story.**

Use stuffed animals or act it out yourself.

Fun on the go...

- **Play a game of “Can you...?”.**

Can you...clap your hands, sing a song, etc. This helps improve concentration and attention.

- **Tell a story together.**

One person starts, and everyone takes turns adding what happens next. This builds vocabulary and sequencing.
